**A**fter a spectacular inaugural season that included a Nostalgia Street Car championship and a second-place finish in the Currie Enterprises Open Comp class, Mike Nordahl throttled back to only a single event in 2013. But he loaded up for a full NMCA West tour in 2014, aiming for another title in three classes. He got off to a great start in the Open Comp class by earning a win over Ryan Clesleigh in Fontana. But, his eliminations stay was a bit shorter at

the next event in Pomona, as Nordahl exited in round two. The mid point of the season found the tour returning to Fontana, and Nordahl kept his magic at Auto Club Dragway intact, as he made his way to the final round and scored a win over Evan Kowalski. Las Vegas hosted the fourth event of the season, and once again Nordahl found his way to the final round. A third win wouldn't be in the cards for Nordahl, as Brent Calvert got the final win light of the day, but that final-round berth sealed Nordahl's Open Comp championship.

**A**nother racer that earned a top-ten finish in Nostalgia Street Car, Evan Kowalski, also did battle in the Currie Enterprises Open Comp class. He started his season with a round-three result in Fontana, but was knocked out early with a round-one loss in Pomona. Kowalski rebounded for a final-round appearance in his second visit to Fontana, earning the runner-up spot to Mike Nordahl. Las Vegas returned Kowalski to first-round-runner-up status, but he pulled it together for a win at the season's final event, vaulting him to the second spot in points.
